MURIEL BOWSER IS FIGHTING TO GIVE ALL WASHINGTONIANS A FAIR SHOT.

Muriel has made unprecedented investments in affordable housing, public safety, and education to improve and strengthen neighborhoods in all eight wards of the District.

- SHARING PROSPERITY ACROSS ALL EIGHT WARDS. Each year, Muriel invested a historic \$100 million to the Housing Production Trust Fund, completing an unprecedented 5,300 affordable housing units. And her investments in employment programs are giving more Washingtonians the chance to share in the District's economic growth.
- CRIME IS DOWN THROUGHOUT DC. In 2017, we had a 22% reduction in violent crime, a 9% reduction in property crime, and an 11% decrease in total crime. This is thanks in part to initiatives Muriel has launched, like her security camera rebate program. Muriel has also worked to develop new training programs to help police understand the African-American experience in DC, and deployed body cams to increase police accountability. Muriel has also provided workforce training for returning citizens to ensure we remain a society of second chances.
- INVESTING IN DC FAMILIES. Muriel has made DC families a top priority. By expanding child care to include over 1,000 new spots for infants and toddlers, identifying three new sites for private child care providers, helping 300 residents become certified educators, and proposing a new \$1,000 refundable child care tax credit per child.
- STANDING UP FOR OUR DC VALUES. Muriel will keep fighting to make DC the 51st state. No matter what happens in the White House, or in Congress, Muriel is committed to making sure the District remains a beacon of diversity and inclusion and that we continue to stand up and fight back.

Rules of the Day

- 1. Call for the quorum: 15 Ward 8 Democrats
- 2. Approve the Rules of the Day.
- 3. Ward 8 Candidate Forum; Candidate Office: Mayor, Delegate to Congress, Shadow Reps
- 4. Time: The event program will be held from 12 noon 2pm.
- 5. Speaking Order: Opening statement, closing statement and first question order will be chosen by closed envelope selection by the moderator.
- 6. Seating Order: Candidates will be seated according to speaking order.
- 7. Candidate Opening Statement: Each candidate will have 1 minute to give an opening statement.
- 8. Question & Answer Period: There will be, at a maximum, a 40-minute question and answer (Q&A) session for the Mayoral and Delegate to Congress Candidate Forum; 35-minute Q&A forum for the Shadow Senator and 5-minute introduction for the Shadow Representative. Each forum will be conducted by a moderator. Members of the audience may ask questions through use of index cards provided. Candidates will have up to 1 minute (if necessary) to respond to all questions.
- 9. Closing Statements: Each candidate will have 1 minute to give a closing statement.
- 10. Campaigning: Campaigning will be allowed on the outside or in the hallway of 3100 MLK Ave SE, ONLY.
- 11. Voter Eligibility: All Ward 8 residents registered to vote before the event will be eligible to participate in the straw poll.
- 12. Provisional Ballots: Provisional ballots will only be allowed for Ward 8 voters who can prove their residency. Provisional ballots will not be counted toward the final vote tally until the voter is verified by the DC Board of Elections.
- 13. Same Day Registration & Voting: There will be no same-day voter registration.
- 14. Curbside/Assisted Voting: Curbside voting will be available for seniors and individuals with disabilities. Please notify the planning committee upon arrival.
- 15. Ballot Position: The names of all candidates will be listed on the voting ballot in alphabetical order.
- 16. Write-Ins: For the purposes of this forum, write-ins will be counted.
- 17. Ballots: Ballots will be prepared by the Planning Committee.
- 18. Registration, Voter Verification: The registration and voter verification process will be Conducted by members of the DC Democratic State Committee.
- 19. Casting Ballots: Ballots may be cast at from 12:00pm–2:00pm the day of the forum using the designated ballot box. Ward 8 Democrats must be in line by 2:00pm to cast a vote.
- 20. The Counting of Ballots: Ballot counting will be conducted by members of the DC Democratic State Committee and will begin immediately after the last ballot is cast.
- 21. Observers: Each candidate will be permitted to designate two observers to monitor the balloting and tabulations.
- 22. Endorsement: The Ward 8 Democrats will ONLY endorse candidates receiving at least 60% of the total vote.
- 23. Results: The results of the Poll will be announced immediately upon completion of the vote tabulation.
